About the Project

WHAT IS THE AYA CANCER PRIORITY SETTING PARTNERSHIP?

Each year, nearly 9,200 adolescents and young adults (AYAs) are diagnosed with cancer in Canada. AYAs with cancer have unique medical and psychosocial needs that often go unmet. The AYA Priority Setting Partnership (PSP) is bringing together AYA patients, caregivers, and clinicians to identify the key areas of research that are needed to improve care for AYAs with cancer in Canada. The PSP will result in a list of Top 10 Research Priorities that will guide a new research agenda. We are following the James Lind Alliance Method for this PSP. Create Steering Group

Composed of equal representation of patients, caregivers, and clinicians. *The first Steering Group meeting was held on April 18, 2023.

- Survey #1: Gather Evidence Uncertainties
 - Patients, caregivers, and clinicians will respond to a survey that asks what questions they want answered by research.
- Summarize Responses Gathered

 All survey responses will be sorted and summary questions will be created. This is the long list of questions.
- Evidence Checking

 The long list of questions is checked against existing research evidence.

 Any questions that have been answered will be removed.
- Survey #2: Interim Priority Setting

 To reduce the remaining long list, patients, caregivers, and clinicians will vote on the most important questions. This is the short list of questions.
- Final Workshop

 The highest ranked 25-30 questions are discussed. Patients, caregivers, and clinics agree the "Top 10" list of priorities.
- **Dissemination**The Top 10 is announced.
